

# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given that a Public Hearing will be held Wednesday, September 7, 2022 at 1:00 p.m. in the Rich County Courthouse, 20 S. Main Street in Randolph. The Rich County Board of Commissioners is considering amending County Ordinance 91-5, governing use of Bear Lake's beaches. A copy of this proposed ordinance can be obtained by contacting the Rich County Clerk, Becky Peart at (435) 793-2415.

Rich County's current ordinance protecting Bear Lake's beaches has been in place since 1991. Recently, the State Legislature passed a statute specifically governing camping, vehicle use, fires etc. on Bear Lake's beaches. See Utah Code § 65A-3-1 (2022). The County is considering amending its beach protection ordinance to be consistent with state law. This ordinance would also extend these protections above the mean high water mark (the boundary of state lands) to all beaches surrounding the lake.

The Board of Commissioners is soliciting the public's comments on the proposed ordinance. Those attending the hearing will be invited to provide their input. Those wishing to comment, but who are unable to attend the hearing may also submit written comments to the Rich County Clerk prior to the hearing.

# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given that a Public Hearing will be held Wednesday, September 7, 2022 at 1:30 p.m. in the Rich County Courthouse, 20 S. Main Street in Randolph. The Rich County Board of Commissioners is considering amending County Ordinance 86-5, governing off-highway vehicle (OHV) use on county roads. A copy of this proposed ordinance can be obtained by contacting the Rich County Clerk, Becky Peart at (435) 793-2415.

Utah state law allows counties, cities, and towns to designate certain roadways as open or closed to off-highway vehicles (OHV's). The County enacted an ordinance in 1986 opening unpaved county roads to responsible OHV use. The County is considering amending the ordinance to allow OHV use on all county roads, unpaved and paved. This would affect only county roadways outside the jurisdiction of towns. This proposed amendment would not affect state roads, which are governed by state law.

The Board of Commissioners is soliciting the public's comments on the proposed ordinance. Those attending the hearing will be invited to provide their input. Those wishing to comment, but who are unable to attend the hearing may also submit written comments to the Rich County Clerk prior to the hearing.
